

#### PART I – INVESTIGATING MODERN HISTORY



The Nature of Modern History – investigation of at least one option including History and Memory, the Construction of Modern Histories, Sites and Sources, the Contestability of the Past, Representation and Commemoration of the Past

Case Study options (at least 2)- could include Genocide in Rwanda, The American Civil War, Tibet, The Romanovs, The Cuban Revolution

#### PART II: HISTORICAL INVESTIGATION

Students can select a topic and presentation style that reflects individual interests – you choose!

Assessment value of 20-30%

Possible investigations include: causes and impacts of a historical event, significance of an event, social and cultural change in a decade of the C20th, an interpretation of an individual



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#### PART III: THE SHAPING OF THE MODERN WORLD

Investigate the forces and ideas that shaped the modern world through a study of key events and developments.

Study one of these topics: The Enlightenment, The French Revolution, The Age of Imperialism, The Industrial Age, World War One, The End of Empire

The search for peace and security








#### **PART II: NATIONAL STUDY**

Students investigate key features, individuals, groups, events and developments that shaped the history of ONE country during the C20th

Options include: Russia and the Soviet Union 1917-1941; USA 1919-1941; Indonesia 1945-2001







#### PART III: PEACE AND CONFLICT STUDY

Students investigate the key features of the history of ONE of peace

and conflict. Options include:

- Indochina 1954-1979
- Conflict in Europe 1935-1945
- The Cold War 1945-1991



#### PART IV: CHANGE IN THE MODERN WORLD

Investigate ONE option, focusing on political and social change, and the role of individuals and groups. Options include:

- Apartheid in South Africa 1960-1994
- The Changing World Order 1945-2011
- Civil Rights in the USA 1945-1968
